Getting Ready For The Daffodil Show

Never exhibited in a daffodil show before? Maybe this is the year to take the plunge! Presumably you've planted wonderful daffodils in the fall, and now you want to exhibit them at the flower show this spring. So, what are some of the things you can do in advance?

Mulch your bulbs. If you haven't mulched when you planted, try to get some mulch on the beds prior to bulb growth. You can do it after growth has started but it is much easier if they're up no more than an inch. You can use fine pine bark, straw, hay, Hershey's cocoa hulls, whatever is convenient for you. Just don't use peat as mulch. When it rains, the spatters from the peat dirties the flowers, and it's hard to get off. It's much easier to remove ordinary soil spots. The mulch is to keep the flowers clean when it rains. If you mulched in the fall you don't need to mulch again.

Walk through your garden frequently, looking for possible blooms to take to the show. If stormy weather, hail, etc., is forecast, you'll want to cut the flowers to bring inside. If it's a cultivar that "burns" easily, you will probably want to cut the flower when it is about ³/₄ open. Put the flower in water, in a dark basement, for a few days to let it mature inside. A fine spray mist from time to time would prove helpful. Flowers will grow larger if you can let them mature in growth, but cutting and putting a dark basement works almost as well. And you don't run the risk of the flower being damaged before the show date.

Some grooming tips: most daffodils should "look you in the eye". So if the head is hanging down, you should gently try to lift it. "Gently" is relative, and you have to practice. Take a flower and push its bloom up, toward the sky. You don't want to push so hard you break the neck, but if you do it right, a bloom that was looking down can be brought up to a pose that is more acceptable to judges. Divisions 5 and 6 flowers are the exception. They tend to look down. The six petals (and if there are less than that, let the flower stay home) should preferably be flat, in the same plane. If the petals are hanging over the cup, or "hooded" push the petals back and gently massage them with your fingers. You'll be amazed how much better the flower looks. The warmth of your hands can do a lot to improve the flower's appearance. You'll hear judges say a flower wasn't "clocked". That means that the upper and lower petals don't line up with the stem in a straight line. So, what to do? Gently, there's that word again, twist the flower head until they line up. This is a small point, but you can see for yourself how much better the flower looks. If you want to enter a vase of 3, choose three blooms that are as close to identical as you can.

OK, your flower looks perfect 10 days before the show date. What now? You're out of luck? No. Cut it and refrigerate it. First clean off any dirt that may be on the flower. You can do this with a Q-tip dipped in water. If the spot is troublesome, put a drop of dishwashing liquid in the water, then gently rub the spot. (If you've mulched, you probably won't have a problem). There are several schools of thought on refrigeration. Some put the flowers in water, with a plastic bag over them and keep them that way. I prefer to put them, without water, into plastic bags and lay them on my refrigerator shelf. When I take them out to exhibit (the night before), I recut the end of the stem and put them in water. Even those that look wilted will probably recover. Doesn't work for miniatures though. You have to put them in water in the fridge to keep. If you don't try it, you won't have the flower, so what have you got to lose?

Know the names of you daffodils. When you plant bulbs, make some kind of map or planting diagram so that you'll know in the spring what you're looking at. Labels in the garden are good, but do diagram also, in case labels get moved by children or animals, or by ground freezing and thawing. As you cut flowers, write the name on the stem, using a ball point pen – or something that won't wash off. (Used with permission).



The Starving Artists Café features artists, sells excellent artwork, the Heifer Project famously raises animals to help people throughout the world. WDS Meeting Minutes Fall 2013

The Washington Daffodil Society Fall Executive Board meeting was called to order by President, Tom Taylor, November 2, 2013, 10:25AM, at Hill Episcopal Church Parish Hall in Alexandria, VA.

Those executive board members present: Tom Taylor, Mary Ann Barton, Mary Koonce, Amelia Abrahams, Martha Best, Donna Clausen, Judy Brunner, Linda Smith, Ruth Ann McGrail, Tricia Goins and Glenna Graves.

Mary Ann Barton moved that we accept the minutes of the last meeting as printed in the Summer Newsletter. Linda Smith seconded the motion.

Treasurers Report: Tricia Goins reported we had deposits of \$10,883.95 from the bulb sales so far. Expenditures to date: \$2,363.32 since June 22, 2013, including bulb orders to nurseries and a \$500.00 deposit to the American Legion Post for our Daffodil Show in 2014. Membership dues received \$250.00. Current total assets, including CD, \$30,416.50.

Holly Ruffin has graciously extended an invitation to have our February meeting at her home in McLean, VA. The date will be February 22, 2014 with a snow date of March 1, 2014.

Bulb Order: Mary Koonce thanked Bob Huesmann for a terrific job of planning and executing the bulb order process, from selecting the bulbs for order to actually packing and delivery to some who had placed orders. His most able assistants were Lina Huesmann, Martha Best, Amelia Abrahams, Mary Koonce and Mary Ann Barton. International bulb orders were delayed on the receiving end due to extended travel to various airports after arrival in the US.

Membership: \$250.00 in dues has been received since June 22, 2013. It was recommended that an additional person to help with membership would be most helpful. Tricia handles all the money but someone to contact garden clubs etc. would be great.

Nominating Committee Report: The committee consisted of Glenna Graves, Mary Ann Barton and Kate Carney. Glenna Graves reviewed the slate as printed in the Fall Newsletter. Tom Taylor, President; Donna Clausen, Vice President; Directors: Judy Brunner 2nd term, Kathy Welsh 1st term, Don Caton, 1st term, Mary Ann Barton 1st term.

Newsletter: Mary Ann Barton thanked everyone who can and will get the WDS Newsletter electronically. This saves postage and time and you also get full color with the photos inserts. Anyone objecting to having your address printed in/on our mailing list please let Mary Ann Barton know.

Website: Our website is now back in operation and the NEW ADDRESS is thewashingtondaffodilsociety.org Be sure to add the <u>the</u> to the address. Please visit and offer suggestions of what you may like the content of our site to be. We want to protect names and not have rosters for the general public so we may develop a password for all "members only" to access pertinent society information.

Joint Venture with Merrifield Garden Center: Tom thanked those members who helped with bulbs sales during the first two weekends in October at the three Merrifield Garden Centers. It is a fun experience. We are not asked difficult garden questions but Merrifield really does appreciate our being there. This is our obligation duty in return for free parking of our show properties building at their Fairfax Garden Center. We do encourage more participation next year.

Daffodil Show: Our daffodil show will be held on April 16-17-18, 2014 at the American Legion Fairfax Post #177, 3939 Oak Street, Fairfax, VA. Our show will be on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday – not the weekend as in the past. As we are in a new location our members are busy measuring and planning to accommodate a beautiful show. We will need a lot of manpower so I encourage everyone to come and help anytime during the show time period--setting up tables, setting up workroom, placement of blooms, helping with food for exhibitors and judges, photography set-up, clerking etc. We will have the Artistic Section as well. This show will also be the Mid Atlantic Regional Show so the opportunity for the challenge of few extra classes will be there as well.

New Business: Steve Morrison offered a suggestion for consideration for future meetings. He recommended having a reusable Daffodil sign to be placed at the entrance of wherever a meeting is to be held. A sign that would catch the eye and help with locating the entrance. Perhaps someone would undertake this task.

Another suggestion was offered to consider combining our show or programs with another gardening group. This could help in publicizing both groups and perhaps get more involvement. Mary Koonce encouraged us to plant more bulbs in our areas to draw more attention to daffodils as well as beautifying the areas. 
