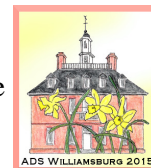

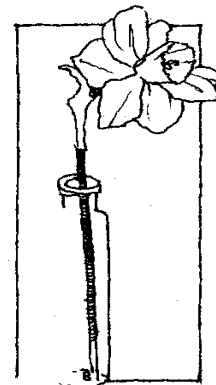

Spring – Time for Beautiful Daffodils By Glenna Graves

Spring will soon be here, but before then we will all be out checking our gardens to see when the first green daffodil tips are showing. That is one thing exciting about this ‘dreary’ time of year – anticipation of those blooms to come!

We know everyone is not interested in showing daffodils at a show but hopefully I may give a few guiding suggestions and helpful hints to help you grow healthy, pleasing daffodils, and perhaps win a ribbon or two as well.

I have gleaned excerpts of information from the Northern California Daffodil Society, the Daffodil Society of Great Britain, The ADS Journal and my own personal experience of growing and showing daffodils that I will pass along for your information.

If your bulbs have been down for a few years you may want to top-dress the bed and work in some low Nitrogen fertilizer into the soil. You probably fertilized when your bulbs were planted but at this time of year you can top-dress again with a 5-10-10 when leaf tips emerge.

Daffodils need a lot of water while growing. It is great to get at least 1” of rain per week but if not watering is encouraged. This will help with the substance of the blooms and the smoothness of the petals when opened. Continue to water for three weeks after blooming as the bulbs are making their next year’s bloom but then stop. Daffodils need a resting period and to be dormant. Whether we are cutting blooms for a show or growing for your own garden beauty we need to take note of a few steps in culture. If your clumps this spring produce few blooms, or none, perhaps you need to divide the clumps and give the bulbs more room. Also maybe they are not getting enough sun. If they have been planted for few years the trees and shrubs they were planted close to may have grown and perhaps overtaken the daffodil light source. Even while blooming they could be moved to another location if you want. Show bulbs usually are lifted every two to three years to encourage larger bulb growth and bigger blooms.

Entering a Show offers several considerations as well. Many times the biggest mistake a beginner can make is cutting the blooms too early. Most cultivars in normal conditions will take about seven days to fully open to prime condition. Pick while they are in good condition – old enough for proper color development but young enough to avoid weather damage or signs of withering. A good indication is when the pollen has formed on the anther. If the weather is very warm it can be a much shorter time. Most flowers are best cut a day or two before the show to benefit by water intake and aiding in smoother petals. Cut the flowers in the early AM when sap is rising and before the sun gets too warm. A waterproof ballpoint pen can be used to write on the stem when cutting for identification purposes. Just remember that bleach if added to water will dissolve the ink so be sure to write the name high enough on the stem to be above water level. Place the stems in tepid water for good water absorption then later move to cold water.

Groom your blooms soon after picking. This includes removing dirt, stain, dust but never remove the brown papery ‘spathe’ (the husk that enclosed the bud) as this is an essential part of the bloom and removal will deduct points in the judging process. Do not wait until show day to clean- there is never enough time to do everything!

In getting your blooms ready for the show, especially if they are standards and are to be in a collection, try to make sure they are looking you in the eye when in the container. If they have drooping heads this can often be corrected by placing the bloom in a room four or five hours with a strong light above the bloom. The head will rise to get to the light.

Blooms are best stored in a darkened cool room overnight or if gathered and need to keep for several days can be stored in a refrigerator. The temperature should be set above freezing of course but cooler is better. Moisture is very important to keep the petals from drying out. A wet towel placed on a shelf and spraying the sides of the refrigerator can help. I use a dry-cleaner bag hooded over my flower container of blooms when saving them.

Before the Day of the Show check to make sure your show box is ready and contains all materials you may need at the show: Q-tips, paper, pen, scissors, cleaning brushes, show schedule and entry cards already filed out if you have them. You can always call the show chairman of the different shows and they will send you entry cards allowing time to get them filled out early. Also remember to always have/bring mailing NAME LABELS for the entry cards. This saves tons of time when entering.

Entering a COLLECTION. If you have never entered a collection (five or more stems to a class) it can be intimidating but don't let it be. For our WDS show there is a class – 278 Novice Class – calls for one stem of five different cultivars. This class is open to only those who have never won a blue ribbon for a collection in an ADS show before. Bring five different blooms and enter. When in the tubes/block you want them to all be the same height for better presentation. The height will depend on the shortest stem you have....you can always cut off longer stem but you are stuck when you have a shorty! Remember this when cutting your blooms for all classes, cut as long as you can without cutting into the “white” base of the stems. Generally you want your best blooms for use in a collection. Each flower should be able to stand on its own merit. Many times a collection has failed to win because one flower lets down the others. SIZE is also an important consideration. You want to balance the size of your blooms. If you have one small type bloom and the rest large standards it would be good to try to find another of the same general size. The same would go for all smaller blooms in a collection if possible. In a larger collection, say the Quinn, usually you would place the larger blooms on the top tier and the smaller ones in the front as this helps to balance the perspective of the entry. There is no absolute rule but it is also recommended to alternate the yellow and white or other colored blooms in a larger collection. You do not want all yellows together, then all whites and then all pink or oranges. Presentation is better when alternating the colors when possible. ALWAYS double check you bloom name labels when placing on the shelf. Often names get switched as you move your blooms around for better presentation and the name is not moved with it. That has happened to me and other large collection entries as well, not just the beginners.

ALWAYS take some spare blooms in case there is a casualty before the collection is entered. That too happens sometimes. Bring your blooms and do enter any of the classes. If you need help we are here to HELP, just ASK!

Daffodils in the news – Ranson WV

Mary Koonce of WDS helped with this project: 300 Symbols of Hope

Three hundred Daffodils were planted last December to enhance the City of Ranson's ongoing street landscaping project. The daffodil has become an international symbol of hope for those stricken by cancer and cancer survivors. Originally proposed by Mary Everhart Koonce as a project for the Dolley Madison Garden Club, the result was a wonderful example of community cooperation. Mary, an accredited Daffodil judge, made the bulb selection and noted that they are hardy and low maintenance. Dolley Madison Garden Club provided the funds. Actual planting was done by Ranson public works employees, Curtis White and Robert Hawkins, with volunteer help from Jefferson County Ministries. Overall design was under the supervision of Susan Hall of R & L Landscaping. Expect to see blooms in mid-April in shades yellow, white, orange, and pink! Mayor Dave Hamill was on hand to thank the participants and said, “these symbols of hope were planted by folks who care for their community.” Linda Briganti, president of Dolley Madison Garden Club said, “an important part of our club's mission is to beautify and enhance the environment in our Jefferson County community.” It is the rare person who has not been touched by cancer, be it friend, neighbor, family or one's self. Look for the Daffodils and take heart.

WDS Meeting Minutes Fall 2014

November 1, 2014

The Nov 1, 2014 Fall meeting of the Washington Daffodil Society was called to order by President Tom Taylor at 10:45 AM at the Immanuel on the Hill Episcopal Church Parish Hall, Alexandria, VA.

Board members present: Tom Taylor, Donna Clausen, Glenna Graves, Martha Best, Amelia Abrahams, Linda Smith, Judy Brunner, Kathy Welsh, Don Caton, Mary Ann Barton and Mary Koonce. Joy Duncan and Karen Cogar were also in attendance.

The motion was made and seconded to dispense with the reading of the June minutes and be accepted as published in the Fall Newsletter.

Mary Ann Barton read the treasurer's report as prepared by Tricia Goins WDS Treasurer. The current balance: Checkbook \$15,156.77; CD \$10,192.87; Total assets - \$25,349.54. It was noted not all the international bulb suppliers had yet been paid for their bulbs supplied. A question arose about speakers fees noted in the Treasurer report. Mary Ann Barton reported this was income derived from two programs she had presented to garden clubs and donated to WDS.

Bulb Order – Mary Koonce reported some of the bulbs ordered from nursery's had been very late in arriving – shipping around the US. However, bulb orders placed by WDS members and associates have been prepared. Refunds or substitutions will be necessary in some cases.

Daffodil Show – Mary Ann Barton 2015 show chairman reported our daffodil show would be held in the same location as last year, the American Legion Hall, Fairfax, VA. The date will be **April 15-16-17, 2015, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.**

There will be only a minor change in our schedule for next year as now the Red, White, and Blue Ribbon will also be eligible for the Lavender Ribbon as well. Discussion followed about the trifold educational stand used at many shows and its current location. It is believed to be at Kathy Welsh or the properties building.

Tom Taylor thanked those who assisted Merrifield Garden Center's three locations with bulb sales for the weekends of October 4-5 and 11-12th. There was discussion of encouraging more participation.

Nominating Committee – Glenna Graves, Nominating Committee Chairman, read the proposed slate of new officers and directors. Noting the fact we had four directors on our slate Kathy Welsh referred to By Laws Amendment in which the number of directors was to be determined by the Board but we were not to have less than three directors proposed. Previously it was listed as having four directors on the slate. The proposed slate: Karen Cogar, President; Mary Koonce, Vice President; Directors: Joy Duncan, Mary Schwegler, Susan Miller and Lina Burton.

Tom Taylor announced since he was moving he had placed many Mitsch catalogs, ADS Journals and new onion bags on the table free for the taking.

New Business – We have been invited to the home of Karen Cogar for our March meeting. The date will be announced later. Steve Morrison offered a warm "thank you" to Tom for all he had done for the WDS and daffodils as Tom will be leaving the area. Steve also offered for consideration perhaps the WDS would be interested in merging with another plant group/society in order to receive the benefits of more workers and sharing the cost of meeting and show space. There are many local plant shows in the area and all are having membership problems. Consideration for a future 'virtual' show film for those unable to attend shows in person was also mentioned.

Website – Tom will talk to Phil Rappa about future postings on our website and also our annual payment process.

The board meeting adjourned at 11:30 AM.

General Meeting and Bulb Exchange –

Following a lunch of tasty snacks and Halloween candy, the WDS General Meeting was called to order at 1:10 PM by Tom Taylor. There were 46 members and associates in attendance.

Mary Ann Barton gave the treasurer's report. Total Assets: \$25,349.54.

Arboretum: Robert Darling discussed the National Arboretum and the Daffodil Display Garden there. He is concerned about the future of the daffodil collection. The Arboretum is a great horticulture resource for the DC area and surrounds. The Arboretum is only open on weekends now and offers limited access for monitoring the collections and bloom times for record keeping. Scott Acres is still part of the Arboretum staff and reassured the new curator would be able to handle the plants and collections. Robert asked that anyone in the WDS to please occasionally stop by the Arboretum and see the display gardens and their condition. During the 2016 World Daffodil Convention, to be held in St. Louis, Missouri on April 6-10, there will be undoubtedly people including the National Arboretum on their agenda as well.

Bulb Order- Mary Koonce thanked those workers who helped with organizing the bulb order to be picked up. Martha Best, Amelia Abrahams, Leigh Koonce and Bob Huesmann have spent many hours in the process. Mary also informed about the raffle tickets for special bulbs and also extra bulbs that were for sale. Bob Huesmann also offered recognition and thanked Mary Koonce for ALL the work she has done in preparing these bulb order materials and getting the orders ready for delivery for years. Thank you Mary!

Newsletter – Mary Ann Barton gave an update on the Newsletter. Thanks to those receiving the Newsletter electronically she now only sends out about 40 issues in the mail. Robert Darling reminded us to keep a hard copy file of all the Newsletters for Historical Archives. Currently Mary Ann Barton, Glenna Graves and Kathy Welsh do have hard copies.

Website – The website is up and running per Tom Taylor. Keep checking for updates. Tom will be talking to Phil Rappa for continued management as Tom will be moving.

Merrifield Garden Update- Tom thanked all those who had assisted at the Merrifield Garden Centers to help sell bulbs in October. Discussion followed as to better recognition of the WDS members at the Garden Centers and exactly what our purpose was in being there. Posters and aprons would bring more recognizing attention to our society.

Nominating Committee-

Glenna Graves announced the proposed slate of officers and directors. President, Karen Cogar; Vice-President, Mary Koonce; Directors: Mary Schwegler, Susan Miller, Joy Duncan and Lina Burton. Bob Huesmann proposed the vote to be by acclamation.

ADS Membership –Kathy Welsh discussed the importance and value of an ADS Membership. Kathy offered a special discount to those attending for a new membership today she would pay \$10.00 of the membership fee. Richard Ezell, Robert Darling, Kathy Welsh all discussed the great opportunities offered with ADS membership such as Daffseek in finding names and information about many daffodils; offering global viewing access for the genius Narcissus as there are website contributors from many countries to maintain the photos and information of new and old cultivars; receiving quarterly ADS Journals that are very informative and also making new friends across the world.

ADS Convention 2015 – Williamsburg, VA

Robert Darling encouraged everyone to check their daffodil photos and enter in local shows where photography is offered as well as the convention 2015. Janet Hickman offered there were many other venues at a convention in addition to the actual bloom show. There will be great speakers from many areas of daffodil culture-some will be international speakers. Seminars, refresher session, tours of private gardens in and around Williamsburg, visiting some of Williamsburg special gardens and also a visit to Brent and Becky's Nursery and surrounding area are on the agenda.

Mid-Atlantic Region Report – Julie Minch, VP of the Mid-Atlantic Region of ADS reported we have 18 new members in the Mid-Atlantic Region. Please welcome them in your area. The new President-Elect, Karen Cogar, invited everyone to her home for the February 2015 meeting of the WDS. The date will be announced later.

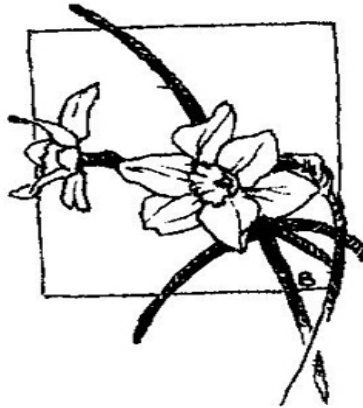
