Message from the President: Dear Daffodil Friends.

Maybe not a whole village, but it took 12 people over 450 hours to produce the WDS Bulb Order last year. Perhaps it is time to take a fresh look at the process, resolve to streamline it, and make the order more sustainable in the future.

Initially, months of substantial and painstaking research are spent determining the 150 candidates for the list. This is no perfunctory exercise. Show records, Daffseek, and supplier lists worldwide are studied. When the list is finally selected, bulbs are ordered and the time consuming jobs of describing the flowers, typing the list, printing it, and distributing it happens. For many years, Bob Huesmann and Mary Koonce have been our brilliant bulb curators, and Mary Anne Barton, with the help of Kathy Welsh, has ensured that the list is produced and delivered.

After your orders arrive, spreadsheets must be created and bulbs are ordered from the growers, another task that Leigh Koonce undertakes so well. Thank goodness for his computer skills! Treasurer, Tricia Goins has her hands full, as well. Not all of the bulbs can be supplied, so more hours are spent resolving this dilemma. Meanwhile, Amelia Abrahams and Martha Best spend 3 days producing a separate label for each bulb with the purchaser's name and order number. Finally, an army of bulb boxes arrive and are carried to the Koonce basement. This is truly a daunting sight. Every box must be unpacked, and each bulb examined. Those bulbs that are viable are reordered in the hopes that they are still available and will arrive in time. The packing of every variety into each individual's bag involves many hours of careful labor. Nearly every individual already mentioned participated in the days of packing. Lina Huesmann, Glenna Graves, and Lucy Rhame put in many hours as well. If you discover a misnamed bulb from your order this year, it was my fault, and I apologize. Orders are shipped or delivered, and an effort is made to share extra bulbs, and also have some special ones available at the Fall Board Meeting. Pretty soon, the process starts all over again.

At the Spring meeting on March 12, 2016, we invite you to come and share your thoughts about the Bulb Order, as well as the future of WDS. The Bulb Order is unique and a very special service to WDS members here and around the country. And it's your club and your flowers and friends, so come.

2016 World Daffodil Convention

April 6-11, 2016 Saint Louis, Missouri

What is a World Daffodil Convention you may ask - 2016 will be the 10th World Daffodil Convention. The initial convention was held in Lower Hutt, New Zealand in 1976. With the exception of 1992 a WDC has been held every four years since.

In 2000 the 6th WDC was held in Portland, Oregon, USA. That was my first ADS convention and I was duly impressed to meet face-to face with many of the people I had only read about. The programs and lectures were very educational and it was very exciting to visit several of the nurseries where we purchase our bulbs.

The World Convention alternates between hemispheres – when in the Southern Hemisphere (September) the convention alternates between Australia and New Zealand. When held in the Northern Hemisphere the site would alternate between USA and United Kingdom/Holland (April). Several of our members attended the 2004 WDC in Melbourne, Australia and the 2008 in London, Northern Ireland and Holland. The 2012 convention was in Dunedin, N.Z. followed by our 2016 convention in Missouri, USA. The next is planned for Canberra, Australia. Start making your plans now for your trip to Australia!

The convention in Missouri offers you opportunities to:

- Make new friends and renew old friendships alike in our world-wide community of daffodil enthusiasts.
- Engage in many educational opportunities
- Observe and participate in a fabulous daffodil show

Getting Ready For The Daffodil Show

Never exhibited in a daffodil show before? Maybe this is the year to take the plunge! Presumably you've planted wonderful daffodils in the fall, and now you want to exhibit them at the flower show this spring. So, what are some of the things you can do in advance?

Mulch your bulbs. If you haven't mulched when you planted, try to get some mulch on the beds prior to bulb growth. You can do it after growth has started but it is much easier if they're up no more than an inch. You can use fine pine bark, straw, hay, Hershey's cocoa hulls, whatever is convenient for you. Just don't use peat as mulch. When it rains, the spatters from the peat dirties the flowers, and it's hard to get off. It's much easier to remove ordinary soil spots. The mulch is to keep the flowers clean when it rains. If you mulched in the fall you don't need to mulch again.

Walk through your garden frequently, looking for possible blooms to take to the show. If stormy weather, hail, etc., is forecast, you'll want to cut the flowers to bring inside. If it's a cultivar that "burns" easily, you will probably want to cut the flower when it is about ¾ open. Put the flower in water, in a dark basement, for a few days to let it mature inside. A

fine spray mist from time to time would prove helpful. Flowers will grow larger if you can let them mature in growth, but cutting and putting a dark basement works almost as well. And you don't run the risk of the flower being damaged before the show date.


Some grooming tips: most daffodils should "look you in the eye". So if the head is hanging down, you should gently try to lift it. "Gently" is relative, and you have to practice. Take a flower and push its bloom up, toward the sky. You don't want to push so hard you break the neck, but if you do it right, a bloom that was looking down can be brought up to a pose that is more acceptable to judges. Divisions 5 and 6 flowers are the exception. They tend to look down. The six petals (and if there are less than that, let the flower stay home) should preferably be flat, in the same plane. If the petals are hanging over the cup, or "hooded" push the petals back and gently massage them with your fingers. You'll be amazed how much better the flower looks. The warmth of your hands can do a lot to improve the flower's appearance. You'll hear judges say a flower wasn't "clocked". That means that the upper and lower petals don't line up with the stem in a straight line. So, what to do? Gently, there's that word again, twist the flower head until they line up. This is a small point, but you can see for yourself how much better the flower looks. If you want to enter a vase of 3, choose three blooms that are as close to identical as you can.

OK, your flower looks perfect 10 days before the show date. What now? You're out of luck? No. Cut it and refrigerate it. First clean off any dirt that may be on the flower. You can do this with a Q-tip dipped in water. If the spot is troublesome, put a drop of dishwashing liquid in the water, then gently rub the spot. (If you've mulched, you probably won't have a problem). There are several schools of thought on refrigeration. Some put the flowers in water, with a plastic bag over them and keep them that way. I prefer to put them, without water, into plastic bags and lay them on my refrigerator shelf. When I take them out to exhibit (the night before), I re-cut the end of the stem and put them in water. Even those that look wilted will probably recover. Doesn't work for miniatures though. You have to put them in water in the fridge to keep. If you don't try it, you won't have the flower, so what have you got to lose?

Know the names of you daffodils. When you plant bulbs, make some kind of map or planting diagram so that you'll know in the spring what you're looking at. Labels in the garden are good, but do diagram also, in case labels get moved by children or animals, or by ground freezing and thawing. As you cut flowers, write the name on the stem, using a ball point pen – or something that won't wash off. (Used with permission).

Washington Daffodil Society – 2015 Fall Meeting Minutes

The October 24, 2015 WDS Board Meeting held at the Trinity United Methodist Church, Mc Lean, VA, was called to order by President Karen Cogar at 9:30 Am. Those members present were Karen Cogar, Mary Ann Barton, Glenna Graves, Don Caton, Linda Smith, Judy Bruner, Trticia Goins, Bob and Lina Huesmann, Robert Darling, Kathy Welsh, Steve Morrison, Joy Duncan, Janet Hickman, Leigh Koonce and Lina Burton.

Treasurer Report – Tricia Goins: Total assets are \$26,977.35. Income from June 1-October 15, 2015 - \$10,724.20. This includes membership dues and bulb order sales. Expenditures until the present are \$ 1768.85 for bulbs from growers and was also noted several of the invoices from other growers have not arrived yet. Other expenses included the reimbursement for bulbs unavailable to those not wanting substitute bulbs on orders. Total bulb order income will be announced at the next meeting. It was noted the \$40 membership

dues paid was to the National Capitol Area Garden Clubs, Inc. rather than the Garden Club of America.

Minutes of the June 20, 2015 meeting - Glenna Graves-

Joy Duncan made the motion to accept the minutes as printed in the Fall 2015 Newsletter . Bob Darling seconded the motion. The minutes were filed as printed.

National Arboretum – Robert Darling: Robert reported that Dr. Olsen is now the Director of the National Arboretum. There has been a donation made allowing the Arboretum to be open seven days a week now rather than the four days previously. This makes it more convenient for visitors and workers to be in the arboretum. Robert again asked for a committee to help him at the arboretum. This would consist of monitoring the health and blooming times of various daffodils in the collection. It would also alert the Arboretum staff that we are concerned and monitoring the daffodils. There are over 500 bulbs planted there. Many were planted when Delia Bankhead was a member of WDS and helped in planting the beds. Many growers in the US and international growers donated bulbs to be planted in the Arboretum. In some cases this may be the only known plantings remaining of some cultivars.

Bulb Order and Sale - The bulb sale this year has involved many WDS members. As Mary Koonce was ill, her son Leigh and Bob Huesmann were very involved in preparation of the order selections as well as receiving the bulbs from growers. Amelia Abrahams and Martha Best again

organized and printed all the labels for the individual bags, Mary Ann Barton printed the bulb order for distribution, Karen Cogar, Lucy Rhame, Glenna Graves, Martha and Amelia, Bob and Lina Huesmann and Leigh Koonce sorted and packed the order bags. Thank you to everyone. **Membership Kathy Welsh** – Currently we have 148 active members. Kathy has spent many hours attempting a personal contact with those behind in their dues and 50 names have been deleted from the membership list for non payment.

Dues currently are: Individual 1 year - \$15; 3 years \$40; Family one year \$20 and 3 years. \$50.

Newsletter – Mary Ann Barton - Only 35 Newsletters were mailed out as hard copy. There were a few members that apparently did not receive their electronic Newsletters so Mary Ann has changed or corrected some of the email addresses. Please let us know if you are not getting your Newsletter and also if you have an email address change.


With no new business the meeting was adjourned at 10:10AM

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING 11:30 AM. 35 members present

Following lunch with a delicious assortment of food and time spent shopping the bulb sale table as well as browsing the bulb exchange tables the meeting for the General Membership was called to order by Karen Cogar..

- The minutes were approved as printed in the Fall Newsletter.
- The Nominating Committee of Kathy Welsh, Tom Taylor, Glenna Graves presented the slate for new officers: President- Karen Cogar,, for one year term; VP was open, Directors; Bob Huesmann, Robert Darling, Glenna Graves for 3 year term. - Will be Part 1 of a Three Part Judging School for those interested in becoming a judge.
- Leigh Koonce volunteered to work on the Bulb Order for 2016. Thank you Leigh.
- Chambersburg and Maryland Daffodil Societies announced they sold all the WDS Sale bulbs sent for their fall meetings.
- Boutique Supplies Kathy Welsh had remaining supplies from previous boutiques and encourages everyone to buy!!
- **Steve Morrison** suggested joining forces with another flower group that does not bloom when daffodils are blooming. Two societies could help each other with man power and interest and be mutually helpful. Robert Darling thought there was merit in looking into this further. Steve could check with Master gardeners group as well. Discussed ways of advertising all flower and plant society shows and meetings.
- **Richard Ezell** discussed his Experiment in determining the best planting depth for bulbs. Three members "won" a bag of 12 bulbs that are to be divided into groups of four bulbs each and planted at depths of 2, 6 and 10 inches. These plantings will be monitored for two years and then evaluated as to bulb growth and bloom quality for each group. Those participating are Ceci Brown, Katherine Beale, and Glenna Graves.
- **Robert Darling** gave a heart -warming tribute in memory of Mary Koonce. Several other society members also gave remembrances and tributes to Mary for all that she had contributed to the club and individuals.


