The 2016 WDS Bulb Order Buyer's Guide by Bob Huesmann

Here are some comments, additional to those on the 2016 Bulb Order, which I hope will be helpful in sorting out your selections. It was a pleasant surprise to see our WDS Bulb of the Year, the well-named Resplendent, commercially available again after many years, and at a very good price, apparently a result of the productive genius of the Dutch bulb industry. Also, tucked away in the general list are two Pannill award winners, American Dream 1 Y-P and Oregon Pioneer 2 Y-P. Both could have been Bulb of the Year selections but quantities are limited. Another rescue from the Havens heritage is Smooth Sails 3 W-W, the child of two classics: the often-awarded Verona and Silken Sails, one of Mary Koonce's favorites. Then there is Woodstar, our first-ever mini Bulb of the Year. It was (again) best-in-show this year. It's hard to get--and keep--a healthy bulb of Lemon Silk 6 YYW-W. I, and others, have found Inca (Reverse of the Year) to be less frustrating, and it's a jaunty, very showable flower with obvious cyclamineus form. Brian Duncan, the hybridizer of Burt House (pink of the year), thought it when introduced to be the best of his many flowers in that class, and the record supports that. We reserved the limited quantity available at a special price. Another beautiful award-winning Duncan 2 W-P, Version, is on the general list. It differs from Burt House, with a near-trumpet corona of light pink which has an almost white rim. Both of these are on our list for the first time. The third excellent Duncan 2 W-P on the list, Lake District, is yet different with an attractive cup that is paler toward the base. Modulux, the Downunder Bulb of the Year, is a must-have. (Ask any old-timer!) It is a healthy grower and virtually always produces cut-and-show flowers. The cup fades to white within a few days, but the yellow rim remains and the flower is so beautiful at that stage, too.

If you like yellow--and who doesn't?--consider American Gold 1 Y-Y, and the intermediate Mighty Mite, both in the Newer and Interesting section. Mighty Mite was a winner in St. Louis this year. There are also two fine Duncan 1 Y-Y's in the general list. Kingsleigh is a sibling of Temba and has inherited the same smooth, rounded perianth, but has a bit more expanded corona frilled at the rim. One of our major growers rates the other one, Barnesdale, as the best of Duncan's 1 Y-Y's. All three of the large-cupped yellows offer exceptional value at their prices. Clouded Yellow, our 2015 Bulb of the Year, is offered again in case you missed out on it last year. (The same is true of Silent Valley 1 W-GWW which was best classic in St. Louis this year.) Also check out the new, lower price for Burravoe 1 Y-WWY, one of Ron Scamp's best flowers; it's a Trumpet Warrior child. There are two Div 2 reverse bi-colors on the list. Helford Dawn, awarded by the RHS, is probably earlier than the Daffseek "M" indication. My Sunshine, a Hambledon child, is larger and later.

Cape Cornwall 2 Y-YYO is another of Scamp's best, a gold ribbon winner. Fire-Blade, one of the few Postles bulbs this year, was in the winning English-bred collection in St. Louis. Ruddy Rascal 2 Y-R, from the excellent parents Patabundy and Burning Bush, blooms usefully late mid-season and is finally available at a reasonable price. Angel's Wood, a mid-season bloomer, is highly rated by its grower. We listed Coliseum 2 W-YYO in 2010 at a much higher price. The rather wide cup, with its sun-resistant rim, is eye-catching. Hot Embers 2 W-GOP (that's the color code, not a political statement!) is a newly available Duncan cultivar (Alston x Soprano), apparently the first and only one in its color code. Warm Welcome 2 W-GWP is welcomed thusly to our list, down from its \$60 intro price. If you need to replenish your Div 2 whites, this is a good year to do it a a very reasonable cost. All three on the list are good ones. I grow Areley Kings, and it's a healthy grower, a very consistent and floriferous producer of showable blooms that last a long time.

Nonchalant 3 Y-GYY is one of those aging cultivars that simply won't fade away and keeps winding up in winning exhibits. The perianth of Bossa Nova 3 O-R is light yellow with an orange cast to it that contrasts so beautifully with the red cup, and it can be very smooth, too, without that bothersome center rib. It's under-appreciated. Armidale 3 Y-O has celebrated parents (Burning Bush and the multiple best-in-show Triple Crown) and is a good choice for the later shows. For 3 W-Y's, this is an abundant year, with three really superior show cultivars: Astrid's Memory, Halley's Comet and Moon Shadow. Hartlebury 3 W--ORR has been around for a while, but Kathy Welsh took one all the way to gold at the national show a few years ago. (Just a personal comment here: Although there are a relatively few cultivars like Clouded Yellow, Banker, etc that are multiple times gold ribbon winners, a majority of the cultivars on our list are capable of best-in-show if they are grown well AND the soil, moisture and weather conditions are just right. If we only knew exactly what those conditions were, and could duplicate them!!)

The doubles on the list this year deserve wider recognition, in my opinion. Greek Surprise 4 W-Y is an improvement over Duncan's earlier cultivars in its class. The name just seems a bit off-putting to me. Heamoor 4 Y-Y and Madame Speaker 4 Y-O are never hyped, but they persist in appearing in winning collections. Gay Tabor 4 W-O is an unregistered Dutch variety, so an unlikely candidate for our list, but you should have seen the one Janet Hickman had in her winning collection at Chambersburg a couple of years ago. I grew it this year, and it's very similar to Gay Kybo, a big, full blossom with smooth petals and bright orange corona segments. I'm going to give Vivash 4 W-P a try this year. I'm hopeful that it may be an alternative for those of us on this side of the Atlantic--myself included--for whom the great Dorchester won't bloom.

Tuesday's Child 5 W-Y, another classic, has given me very well-formed late-season blooms. The same goes (except it's early) for Whang-Hi 6 Y-O. It's absolutely delightful--like Beryl, but a bit larger and with richer coloration. My first Throckmorton of the season always has one at the end of the first row. Based on the smooth blooms from the two Scamp Div 7's we listed last year (Hugus and Littlefield) I am optimistic about Treble Two 7 Y-GYY. Silver Smiles 7 W-Y from Brent Heath also appears to be a cut above others in smoothness and overall form. Among the split coronas, Saxby and Marion Pearce are siblings. The latter is an intermediate in the U.K., at 85 mm just a shade over the ADS limit--but judges are usually lenient! Cosine 11a W-P is a child of the wonderful Trigonometry and has a very richly colored corona.

In the Classics section note the correct registration date for Kimmeridge is 1968, not 1975 (sorry, my error), so it is indeed eligible as a classic entry. There is a very strong group of intermediates on the general list. Among them, Quiet Magic 2 W-P has been a consistent winner in the U.K., and it could well have been included in our Newer and Interesting section. Miniature fanciers will note several varieties on the list that haven't been available for some time, at pretty reasonable prices. There are some interesting species there, too, including n. cyclamineus.

LIMITED QUANTITIES! Some bulbs are available only in limited quantities. I've noted American Dream and Oregon Pioneer. Others are Astrid's Memory, Quiet Magic, Cosine, Crevenagh, Moon Shadow, and all three of the poets. Please order early, folks. It helps you avoid a "sold out" situation, and if you order early it also helps us to avoid the substitutions and refunds that nobody likes. Thank you for your support of WDS, and I hope you find a good many bulbs on the list that will give you some happy days next spring.

Treasurer report: President Cogar presented the treasurer report. Profit of the 2015 bulb order was \$4,796.03. A detailed report will be provided upon request.

Minutes: Joy Duncan made a motion we accept the October 24,2015 minutes as printed in the last WDS Newsletter. Seconded by Don Caton.

Bulb Order: Bob Huesmann presented a draft of 141 bulb selections for our 2016 bulb order with the anticipation of adding a few more choices depending on growers' availability. It is anticipated that the order will be completed and ready for distribution by the ADS Convention and daffodil show time.

The 'import permit' for receiving international bulbs will be transferred to Karen Cogar as it had previously been in the name of Mary Koonce.

Bulb Choice, a British wholesale company that coordinates bulbs from Holland, England, etc. for orders, will be added to our purchase list.

Mary Ann Barton will print the bulb order forms for distribution and then receive the orders for tabulation. The bulbs will be shipped to Karen Cogar to prepare for distribution, Amelia Abrahams and Martha Best will again make the labels for all bulb bags then several members will assist in sorting, bagging and mailing. Volunteers are welcome to

At the fall meeting we plan to have the bulb auction, raffles and bulb exchange as we did last year with the income of each recorded separately, if feasible, for comparison.

The fall WDS meeting is tentatively set for October 22, depending on the location availability. **Bulb order deadline** date – May 31, 2016.

A new class has been designated as the Mary E. Koonce Award-Daffodil Parent and Child (previously known as the Bloomer Award). We hope to have many entries in this class. To get more information for parent and child submit a bloom name on the ADS Query page, click on Descendants button and you will see the 'children'. EX: Submit bloom AIRCASTLE and you will see this bloom has been a parent 57 times. Some of the children are Earthlight, Ginger, Oryx, Spindletop, Pogo etc. Check it out.

Alternate show and meeting venues was discussed. Karen Cogar will investigate having a regular meeting at River Side Farm, American Horticulture Society Headquarters, and also inquire about available space and cost of having a show there in the future.

The Board meeting was adjourned at 12:10PM
