

## WASHINGTON DAFFODIL SOCIETY BULB ORDER - 2019 ORDER DEADLINE - MAY 15, 2019

Dear WDS Members,
Welcome to the Washington Daffodil Society bulb order for 2019. Again this year our focus is to offer show ribbon winners from overseas and here in the colonies.

## WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO VIEW EACH OFFERING YOU ARE CONSIDERING ON DAFFSEEK.

Every bulb on our list is of show quality and most should thrive in your garden landscapes as well. Most have been Gold (best of show) or White (best 3 of a kind) ribbon winners, or in winning collections in the last few years, and are new and highly recommended.

Explanation of classification and color coding: the number is one of 13 Royal Horticulture Society divisions -- 1 is trumpet, 2 is large cup, etc. The letters indicate color; perianth color follows the division number, and the cup color beginning at the eye is shown after the hyphen. ( $\mathrm{Y}=$ yellow, $\mathrm{G}=$ green, $\mathrm{O}=$ orange, $\mathrm{P}=$ pink, $\mathrm{R}=$ red.) The name of the originator and date of registration follow. Blooming time is signified as $\mathrm{E}=$ early, $\mathrm{M}=$ mid-season, and $\mathrm{L}=$ late.

- ALL BULBS ARE OFFERED SUBJECT TO CROP VARIATIONS.
- If you plan to attend the WDS meeting, your bulbs will be available so please DO NOT ADD POSTAGE. If you place your order through one of our valued garden clubs, all bulbs must be sent to one address and only a single order will be accepted. INTERMEDIATE OF THE YEAR: MIGHTY MITE 1YYG-Y E-M (Reed, 2012) A standout, and frequent best intermediate in show winner. Super consistent and highly recommended.

CONNESEUR's BULB Of THE YEAR: I LOVE YOU 2W-W E-M (van der Veek, 2017) An elegant smooth show flower that is winning overseas. Check it out on DaffSeek...you'll love it even better in person!! Time to splurge!

Hawera 5Y-Y (Thomson, 1928) M-L An Historic, 6-8 hanging florets per stem Mite 6Y-Y (Gore-Booth, 1965) VE A streamlined cyclamineus Segovia 3W-Y (Gray, 1962) M A nice green eye sets off a sunshine yellow cup. Good multiplier
Sun Disc 7Y-Y (Gray, pre-1946) L Aptly named, great overlap creates a nice round flower.

Hollowbridge $3 Y-Y$ (McCaw, 2008) M Included here due to rave reviews from its supplier. Its parents are a $4 \mathrm{~W}-\mathrm{Y}$ and a $3 \mathrm{Y}-\mathrm{GYR}$. Take a chance!!

Pleasant Valley 3Y-R (Crotty, 2003) M A bright \& robust cultivar. Winner of many best in shows in New Zealand.

Shipshewana 3Y-Y (Reed, 2011) M-L A smooth show flower from its famous parent, Haunting. Very limited $\$ 20.00$

Yum Yum 3W-WWY (Jackson, 1986) M-L A delicate yellow rim accents this pure white flower. A great buy at

Ballistic 4Y-O (McClennan, 2010) M A neatly formed double from New Zealand. Ballistic is how its breeder reacted at first glance. Winning classes and Best Double in New Zealand and England $\$ 13.00$

Crackington 4Y-O (Lloyd, 1986) M Wister winner. Very tidy; a long time contender. \$6.00
Greek Surprise 4W-Y (Duncan, 2007) M-L Heavy substance, strong stem, bred from Gay Kybo. Has done well in the Mid-Atlantic states. $\$ 13.00$

Rongoiti Gem 4W-YOO (Hamilton, 2001) M Great contrast between snowy white and deep orange

Sherborne 4Y-Y M (Lloyd, 1989) Dependable classic form. Indispensable for doubles collections; putting an all yellow in the center of five 4's to balance out all those petals.

Canterbury 5Y-Y (van der Veek, 2016) M Already a top show winner overseas. 3-5 flowers per stem in golden yellow.

## DIVISION VI

Causeway Gem 6Y-Y (Turbitt, 2012) E-M A well-formed, downward facing cyclamineus that is distinguished and award-winning...and is notably later than Rapture.

Cotinga 6W-P (Mitsch, 1978) E We really admire the balance of this cultivar with the cup just slightly shorter than the perianth. Watercolor ivory and glowing apricot-pink make for a pretty neat flower.

Emcys 6W-W (de Winter, 2002) E-M Settles in nicely in the mid-Atlantic area. It's vigorous and shows favorably on the show bench.

Moon Raker 8Y-YOO (Hancock; Introduced 1978, not yet registered) L Only one or two florets for this one, but has a unique color code and startling rim.

Ballydorn 9W-0 (Harrison, 2005) L A stunning rare red-cupped poeticus offered last year, but well worth offering again. Don't miss it this time!

Colville 9W-GYR (Scamp,1994) L This is a rare opportunity to acquire one of Ron's poeticus beauties since he is no longer shipping to the U.S. A sad turn of events.

Frank 9W-GYO (Sir Frank Harrison, 2004) L-VL Sir Harrison is known for his love of poeticus cultivars. He awarded 5 stars to this one which was named for him and registered by Nial Watson. 10 only to offer

Molly Malone Cook 9W-GOR (Bellinger, 2002) L An American bred poet with a unique code. Lovely flowers.
