#### 2023 Wister Award:

The American Daffodil Society recognizes outstanding garden daffodils with the John and Gertrude Wister Award. The award was first presented in 1985.



**'Delibes'**, 2 Y-YYO, this large-cupped daffodil is a showstopper in the garden. It has broad greenish yellow perianth segments with a shallow bowl-shaped corona that is lightly ribbed with vivid yellow shading to orange at the mouth that is frilled. This early to mid-season blooming daffodil was registered prior to 1950 and hybridized by F. Rijnveld and Sons from the Netherlands.

#### **Horticulture Hints**

## Daffodils in the Winter and Spring

The December 2022 ADS Journal featured an article by a long-time daffodil grower, hybridizer and member of the Washington Daffodil Society, Clay Higgins. Be sure to check out the entire article in the Journal.

I will briefly point out a few excerpts of his conversation on Daffodils in the Winter and Spring.

If you have bulbs that are unplanted -PLANT THEM NOW! They cannot flourish if not planted and generally will not last until the next planting season. The blooms may not be as good or not bloom this year, but generally will recover by next season.

Inspect your daffodil garden in January and February for signs of varieties beginning to poke up foliage. This is good especially if you experience sub- zero temperatures and may need to add protective mulch. If you notice the foliage has been affected by the cold generally the bulbs will not be automatically killed even if the foliage is damaged. A treatment of fungicide to damaged foliage will usually stop any damage that may occur and keep potential for bulb damage down. The bulb will have a good chance of blooming the following year.

January is a good time to mow in areas where you may have naturalized bulbs growing. Winter weeds grow vigorously when the good weather comes and may cover your blooms.

February/ March – When the majority of daffodil foliage gets two or so inches tall it is time to apply spring fertilizer. Spread low nitrogen fertilizer (5-10-5; 5-10-30 best) over area following guidance on the bag. Do not use high nitrogen fertilizer as you may have all foliage and fewer blooms.

March is now SHOW TIME in many areas. Pick your blooms directly from garden to show if possible and especially look for those of show quality.

Check your daffodils for signs of damage (twisted foliage, brown spots, yellow streaks or splotches on the blooms) all through the bloom season. Rouge or destroy immediately – not on the compost pile – as diseases can be spread by insects. This will help control a disease outbreak. Check your labels. Identify during the season to make sure the label and bloom are the same. Also mark clumps of daffodils that need to be divided and be planted later in the season.

Summary – Plant your bulbs fall or winter. Inspect the daffodils during the winter and apply fertilizer if needed. Watch for early blooms and ENJOY!! Make sure your daffodil locations are properly marked with variety names and attend a few shows and MOST OF ALL HAVE FUN!!! Glenna Graves

There will be speakers like Carleton B. Wood, the Ex-Director of Hill and Dales Estate in LaGrange, GA entitled "The Seasons of Hills and Dales: 180 Years of Garden Making". Staci L. Catron will speak on Women Pioneers in Landscape Architecture and Design in Georgia. She is the Director of the Cherokee Garden Library for the Atlanta History Center. I am sure this will be most interesting.

There will tours offered as well:

Historic Oakland Cemetery consists of 48 acres full of treasures, history and gardens, sculpture, architecture and ancient oak and magnolia trees. It is Atlanta's oldest public park and final resting place of many of the city's most noted citizens.

Gibbs Garden is set on the 220 acre estate of Jim Gibbs and has 16 gardens of various styles.

## Washington Daffodil Society 2022 Fall Meeting Minutes

The WDS Fall Board meeting held at the Trinity United Methodist Church in McLean VA. was called to order by President Mary Anne Barton at 10:15 AM.

Board Members present were: Mary Anne Barton, Kathy Welsh, Karen Cogar, Glenna Graves, Bob Huesmann, Scott Bally, Janet Hickman, Joy Duncan and Lea Shuba.

The minutes as written in the WDS Newsletter were approved as corrected. The correct dates of the 2023 WDS Daffodil Show are April 7-8-9, 2023.

The Treasurer's report was given by Mary Anne Barton in the absence of Treasurer Tricia Goins. The Profit and Loss report and Balance Sheet details are available on request from the Treasurer. On June 23, 2022, Tricia opened a \$50,000.00 CD account at the Apple Federal Credit Union. In order to open an account the WDS had to have a checking account there as well. A checking account of \$55.00 was opened but it will not be used. We have two CD's at the Apple Federal Credit Union totaling \$61,478.98. We currently have approximately \$9000.00 in our current checking account. The current bulb sales income and complete payment to the bulb vendors are not completed and recorded yet.

A motion was made by Karen Cogar that a thank you gift of \$100.00 to Wegmans be given to Tricia in appreciation of all she does for our society as treasurer. Glenna Graves seconded the motion and was approved by membership. Bob Huesmann and Genie Applegate are assisting Tricia in establishing current record keeping.

The slate of officers of WDS for the new year was announced by Glenna Graves Nominating Committee chair. For President: Mary Anne Barton, one year; Vice President, Donna Clausen, one year; Three Directors, three -year term to end Dec. 31, 2025: Anita

Brown, Katherine Power, Glenna Graves.

Bulb Order and Auction -

Karen Cogar and Kathy Welsh gave updates on the bulb order. They are hoping for record bulb sales and auction at today's meeting Many extra bulbs were received from the growers for our sales.

Membership - Kathy Welsh announced we have 135 individual and family members and 13 Garden Clubs as members.

Other Report – Mary Anne Barton gave a talk about daffodils to a local garden club and in appreciation they have donated \$100 to the WDS.

2024 the American Daffodil Society National Show and Convention will be hosted by the Mid-Atlantic Region of the ADS. Co-chairs for the convention are Karen Cogar and Kathy Welsh. The venue will be the Dulles Hyatt Regency Hotel near the Dulles airport.

The dates will be April 10<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> 2024. The dates will proceed the World Daffodil Convention in Holland, and Northern Ireland so that attendees can fly out on Sunday.

There was discussion of the club underwriting certain aspects of the convention. Chairmanships for committees and possible tour venues will be further discussed next meeting.

There is a reciprocal membership of the American Horticultural Society and the American Daffodil Society. There have been several new members joining the ADS as a result. Glenna reported she had sent invitation notes and included a copy of our WDS Newsletter to new ADS members located in our general Society area.



Our next Spring meeting will be held near the first of March 2023. The exact date to be announced. Meeting adjourned at 10:45 AM

Following socializing and perusing the possibilities of the bulb exchange and sales, Kathy Welsh, Vice President called the General meeting to order at 11:30 AM.

The treasurer report was given by Kathy Welsh in Tricia's absence. Not all bulb growers have been paid yet so our totals are not complete. We have a total of \$61,478.98 in CD's at the Apple Federal Credit Union and approximately \$9000 in the checking account. This will all help us with the 2024 Daffodil Convention held in April 2024 hosted by the Mid-Atlantic Region of the American Daffodil Society.

-Karen welcomed all new members to our meeting. She gave detailed description of the bulbs for Raffle and Auction and the process we were following.

Members of WDS -135 individual or families and 13 garden clubs.

Our WDS Daffodil Show will again be held at the Alexandria Scottish Rite Temple in Alexandria. Same location we have met for past few years. Dates are April 7-8-9, 2023. All are encouraged to come and help with set up for the show as well as bringing blooms.

#### Election of Officers:

With no nominations from the floor our slate was voted into office. President, Mary Anne Barton, one year; Vice President, Donna Clausen, one year; Three directors term ending Dec. 31, 2025, were Anita Brown, Katherine (Kaki) Power, Glenna Graves. Vicky Eicher announced she will again be giving daffodil bulbs to all individuals and businesses that sponsor her for the Breast Cancer Walk in Charlottesville. She has been doing this for several years and appreciated all who give her extra bulbs for sharing. One benefit of the money raised by the Breast Cancer Walk allows free mammograms for those underserved populations. All bulbs donated are greatly appreciated.

Following the adjournment of the general business meeting at 11:45 AM, the tickets for door prizes and raffle were drawn, followed by a live auction for 10 very special bulbs.

Thank you everyone for participating in the bulb sales and exchange.

Following notes after the meeting Kathy Welsh reported we had two new members join the WDS and a total of \$3,276.00 was received from the raffle, bulb sales and auction at the meeting.
