Dear WDS Members,



Welcome to the Washington Daffodil Society bulb order for 2023. Thank you for your past support. We truly appreciate all of your kind comments, and are thrilled to be able to supply you with a diverse selection of show quality bulbs. As you study our list, please remember that the Mid-Atlantic will sponsor the 2024 ADS Convention starting April 10 at the Dulles Hilton. Because Karen and Kathy are co-chairs of the Convention, **we will not have a bulb order in 2024**. Thank you for your understanding and happy shopping.

WE ENCOURAGE YOU TO VIEW EACH OFFERING YOU ARE CONSIDERING ON DAFFSEEK. We have included pictures for most not in Daffseek.

The bulbs on our list are of show quality and most should thrive in your garden landscapes. Some are show-quality bulbs that have not been

readily available recently. Others are new and highly recommended. Where noted, there are limited quantities, so ordering early will increase your chances of receiving the bulb.

Explanation of classification and color coding: the number is one of 13 Royal Horticulture Society divisions -- 1 is trumpet, 2 is large cup, etc. The letters indicate color; perianth color follows the division number, and the cup color beginning at the eye is shown after the hyphen. (Y = yellow, W=White, G = green, O = orange, P = pink, R = red.) The name of the originator and date of registration follow. Blooming time is signified as E = early, M = mid-season, and L = late.

HERE ARE THE BUY-LAWS

- Prices are for each bulb unless otherwise stated.
- ALL BULBS ARE OFFERED SUBJECT TO CROP VARIATIONS.
- Most importantly, an <u>April 28th deadline</u> must be adhered to. Any later and we risk that our suppliers will have sold out of some of the choice bulbs.
- For "limited supply offerings", <u>we will not reserve bulbs.</u> They will be given to completed orders in order of receipt. Once supplies run out, refunds or substitutes will be given as designated on the bulb order.

- Bulb pick up and bulb exchange will be on **Saturday**, **October 28th**. You will be notified of the venue. Don't miss the live auctions and amazing bulb picks!
- If you plan to attend the WDS meeting, your bulbs will be available there so please DO NOT ADD POSTAGE.
- If you place your order through one of our valued garden club memberships, please designate your club, BUT ORDER INDIVIDUALLY. Last year the large bulb orders were too difficult to manage and bag.
- We're sorry but we cannot deliver your bulbs to other meetings.
- Shipping within a 50 mile radius is discouraged. *Please* plan to attend the Fall meeting.
- SEE ORDER FORM FOR SHIPPING RATES which include insurance.
- Mail order bulbs will be shipped out the first week of November at the latest. We acknowledge that this is somewhat late, but bulbs shipped by our European vendors are routinely delayed by customs and agricultural holds. We will ship them sooner if possible. Last year they were all shipped by the fall meeting.
- Finally, please DO NOT USE STAPLES. Kathy's fingernails suffer terribly having to take them out of checks and stapled papers.

Don't blame us when you can't stay within your budget this year!

Changing Day 1Y-R (Reed, 2007) (E-M) A stunning red trumpet. Only 10 available. \$25.00

Chanson 1W-P (Duncan, 1997) (M) This elegant pink trumpet has been around for a while, but has been Best in Show as recently as last year. \$5.00

English Caye 1YYW-WWY (Pearson, 1997) (M) This reverse trumpet is a show staple. \$6.00

Kurrewa 1W-W (Jackson, 1995)(M) Just measures a trumpet. Pure white with thick substance. \$15.00

National Treasure 2Y-Y (R&E Haves, 2007) (M) Glissando plus Impeccable has yielded a true,golden treasure. Snap this up while you still can.\$8.00

Oregon Pioneer 2Y-P (Havens, 1995) (M) Too many awards to mention. This 2010 Pannill Award winner is indispensable. \$6.00

Sheelagh Rowan 2W-W (Pearson, 1989) (M) A well respected, frequently exhibited white. Broad perianth sections and smooth substance are hallmarks. It is also a good keeper! \$10.00

Sun Bronze 2Y-O (D. Jackson, 2000) (L) A personal favorite that has been a national Show winner. \$8.00

Thumbs Up 2Y-O (Hamilton, 2006) (M) Are you tiring of best in Show flowers. Here is another one. \$37.00

Veronica Brown 2W-P (Brown, 1999)(M) A lovely pastel cupped flower named for the breeder's mother. This down-under cultivar is exclusive to WDS. \$16.00

Volcanic Fire 2W-YYR (Watson, 2019) (M) We have much respect for Nial's flowers. They are not only beautiful, but he breed's for health and longevity. We present the splurge of the year, bred from Hawaiian Skies. \$40.00

DIVISION III – Small-Cupped Daffodils

Camilla Clara Kate 3W-GYR (Duncan, 2014) (M-L) This is a very white flower with striking red rim. A wonderful addition to collections. \$5.00

Chortle 3Y-W (Jackson, 1993) (M-L) This down-under reverse has great form and changes color as it matures. A lovely flower for your Maroon Ribbon collection. \$6.00

Hot 'n' Spicy 3Y-R (Ramsey, 2010)(M) This is turned around from New Zealand. Admired for its form and color. Highly recommended. \$25.00

Hollowbridge 3Y-Y (McCaw, 2008) (M) Another rare early division 3 with a soft color that would be amazing paired with Chortle in a collection. \$7.00

Lava Flow 3W-P (Duncan 2006) (M-L) A splashy flower whose deep pink corona is banded by deeper red/pink. \$6.00

Moon Shadow 3W-GYY (Postles, 1992) (M-L) The lovely green eye complements the flat smooth perianth and bright yellow cup. \$9.00

Stanley's Goal 3W-W (Postles, 2015)(M) A pure white, very round and rare flower. Only a few available. \$20.00

Tao 3Y-O (Jackson, 1996) (M) A beacon of bright color, this flower is impossible to miss. We lovethat its parent is aptly named Pzaz.\$7.00

Triple Crown 3Y-GYR (Duncan, 1987) A very round, smooth flower. The rim has a stunningetched appearance. This flower has been a favorite for years.\$8.00

DIVISION IV – Double Daffodils

Ferral 4Y-O (Jackson, 1997) (L) A very striking pale/deeper orange combination. \$8.00

Ransom 4YYW-P (Jackson, 1993) (L) One of those fluffy flowers that arrangers cannot resist! And its fertile if you are a breeder. \$8.00

Silken Snow 4W-W (Duncan 2009) (M-L) Very full and very white at maturity. You won't find this beauty anywhere else. An ADS exclusive. \$22.00

Temple Cloud 4W-P/W (Blanchard, 1994) (M) A neat white/pink for the show bench. Really lovely. \$5.00

DIVISION V – Triandrus Daffodils

Bell Star 5W-W (Duncan, 2015) (M-L) A smaller, sweetly scented triandrus with 3-4 florets per stem. The cup fades to white at maturity. \$12.00

Christmas Bells 5W-W (R&E Havens, 2010) Floriferous, pure white and up to 3 florets per stem. \$7.00



Dainty Tale 5W-P (Duncan,) (M) Something truly different that's on the tip top of our wish list this year. The exquisite little flowers have deeply scalloped cups. Not pictured in Daffseek. \$30.00

Hillview 5Y-Y (Duncan 2016) (M-L) A very graceful well-proportionedaddition to this division. 2-3 florets per stem.\$15.00

DIVISION VI – Cyclamineus Daffodils

Causeway Gem 6Y-Y (Turbitt, 2012) (E-M) A nice addition to the class, with an appropriate downward gaze and a broadly flared cup. \$12.00

Elizabeth Ann 6W-GWP (Duncan, 1983) Brian has hybridized and named over 1000 daffodils. (Yes, we counted.) This is the one named for his wife, Betty. It is lovely, graceful, and a true crowd pleaser. \$4.00



Little Pout 6Y-P (Duncan, 2022) (M-L) Almost 40 years after Elizabeth Ann came into commerce, Brian registered this little beauty. It has a shorter cup than many 6's, it its already gaining lots of favorable comments from serious exhibitors. Brand new and a rare color combination make it worth the cost. Not pictured in Daffseek. \$30.00

Northern Skies 6W-P (Mitsch, 2007) (M) We couldn't fill all of the orders for this last year, so we are offering it again. Very well formed with smooth over-lapping petals. \$6.00

Perky 6W-Y (Mitsch, 1970)(E-M) There are very few 6W-Y's available in mid-season. This is a very cute one. \$5.00

Trena 6W-Y (Verry, 1971) (Very Early) An older flower that still knocks it out of the park. Want a sure-thing vase of 3 winner? The elegant pose of this graceful striking bi-color is awesome times three! \$5.00

Velocity 6Y-R (R&E Havens, 1995) (E-M) Despite the intensity of color of this flower, it is sunproof. Its siblings include Biometrics and Flint Arrow. \$6.00

DIVISION VII – Jonquilla Daffodils



Burdeos 7Y-R (Duncan, 2017) (M) Its Surrey parentage shows in the deep colors of this newer jonguilla. Not pictured in Daffseek. \$15.00

Golden Silence 7Y-Y (R&E Havens, 2012)(L) A well-formed solid yellow jonquil.Bred from Regeneration. Only 10 available.\$10.00

Limequilla 7W-W (R&E Havens, 1989)(M-L) 2-3 well-formed greenish white florets per stem. A standout on the show bench. \$4.00

Spring Lights 7Y-Y (R&E Havens, 2007)(M-L) Another stellar Havens jonquilla with 2-4 florets per stem. Ordered with Limequilla, you will have a parent-child entry. \$6.00

Tender Moment 7W-GYP (J&E Frey, 1994) (L) Reoffered, this lovely and graceful flower has a green eye. \$5.00

DIVISION VIII – Tazetta Daffodils

Avalex 8W-Y (Hall, 2010)(E-M) From Avalanche. Very limited quantity available. \$11.00

Castanets 8Y-O (Pannill, 1985) (M) From the state of Virginia, a super floriferous tazetta. \$5.00

Gracie Bear 8W-Y (Welch, 2018) (M) New to us, but popular at the latest ADS auction, this tazetta has 3-9 florets per stem. Plant a few and save some for forcing this winter. \$8.00

Nickelodeon 8W-W (Hall, 2003) (E-M) Each stem is a fragrant bouquet, with lots of white florets. An earlier tazetta from New Zealand. \$5.00

DIVISION IX- Poeticus Daffodils

Chesterton 9W-GYR (Duncan, 1979) (L) Another collectable poet. Bred from Cantabile and Milan. \$5.50

Ireland's Eye 9W-GYR (Ballydorn Bulb Farm, 1979) (L) A bright, traditionally formed poet with a distinctive cup. \$6.00

Lakeland Poet 9W-R (Galyon, 2014) (Very late) A solid red cupped poet. Only 10 to go. \$12.00

Penjerrick 9W-YYR (Scamp, 2001) (L) A more recent poet from Ron Scamp; one of the few we are able to order here in the US. Very limited quantities. \$5.00



Wilde Poetry 9W-GYO (Watson, 2022) (M) A striking mid-season poet from one of our favorite hybridizers. Only 7 to sell, so please list substitutes. Sold for \$250 at the ADS auction. No picture in daffseek.

DIVISION X1 – Split Corona Daffodils

Bobby Dazzler 11aW-R (Duncan 2021) (E-M) The bright, neat corona make this a real dazzler!There are few with this color code and this is the best in its class.\$41.00

Cosine 11aW-P (Duncan, 2012) (M) Trigonometry x Diversity with a deep coral pink cup \$15.00

Jodi 11bW-P/W (Duncan, 2002) (M-L) A beautifully formed papillon split is in a class with few show-worthy contenders. Named for Brian's granddaughter, this flower is at the top of its class. \$15.00

Saxby 11aY-O (Nicholl, 2010) A bright split that is also wonderful for arrangers. \$11.00

Tickled Pink 11aY-YPP (Duncan 2007) (M) Pale yellow perianth segments with a multi-colored cup. \$8.00

DIVISION XIII – Species Daffodils

n. assoanus 13Y-Y Native to Spain and southern France this species is a lovely grower and breeder. Mini in size. Usually 1-2 per stem. \$2.00

N. fernandesii var. cordubensis 13Y-Y This jonquilla species is known for its frilly, often lobed cup. Can be exhibited as a miniature with multiple florets per stem. A good grower. \$2.00

n. calcicola 13Y-Y Great for breeding with 2-5 very tiny little blooms. A real charmer that can be exhibited as a mini. \$4.50

n. poeticus var. hellenicus 13W-GYR A smaller, sweetly scented poet. \$5.00

n. willkomii 13Y-Y Another teeny tiny species endemic to Spain and Southern Portugal. In the jonquilla family. \$1.50

Causeway Julie 3Y-YYR (Turbitt, 2015) (M) A very consistent and colorful show flower. \$18.00

Koop 1Y-O (Reed, 2009) (E-M) Best intermediate at last year's ADS Convention. Smooth and vigorous. \$10.00

Pink China 2W-P (R&E Havens, 1994) (M) There have been quite a few 2W-P intermediates since this was introduced, but it still wins regularly in its class. \$4.00

Runkerry 4W-P (Duncan, 2007) (M) A little Dorchester with the same bright frills. \$5.00

Skilliwidden 2Y-Y (Scamp, 2001)(E-M) One of the first intermediates to bloom in our garden. It's really cute, and at this price, buy a lot! Good increaser. \$4.00

Sidley 3W-GYY (Bloomer, 1982) (M-L) A very clean and tidy little flower offered at a great price. \$4.00

MINIATURE Daffodils



Alec Gray 1W-W (Capen, 1987) (E-M) A lovely trumpet that opens with a yellow trumpet that fades to white. \$5.00

Angel's Whisper 5Y-Y (Glenbrook Bulb Farm, 1997) (M) A dainty scented triandrus with up to 5 florets per stem. A bit later than Angel's Breath. \$3.00

Artic Bells 10Y-Y (Blom, 2022) (E-M) Greenish, yellow, upward facing newly registeredbulbocodium. No photos yet.\$2.50



Ballroom Belle 10W-W (Blom, 2022) (Very Early) Brand new, no photo inDaffseek, and probably useful to those with later shows who travel early in theirseason. Great for pots.\$2.50

Chiquitita 7Y-Y (van der Veek, 2021) A fernandesii selection which is tiny, well-formed, and a
great addition to any miniature collection.\$2.50Curlylocks 7Y-Y (Watrous, 1964) (M) This American bred mini has pale yellow perianth segments
and a bright ruffled cup.\$4.00

Dainty Monique 5Y-Y (Dijk, 2000)(M) This hard to find mini has both jonquilla and triandrus in its breeding. Order early. Only a few available. \$5.00

Gipsy Queen 1YYW-WWY (Gray, 1969) (E-M) A light greenish yellow flower with the cup fading to white as it matures. Has ben used extensively in breeding other miniatures. \$1.50

Gipsy Vale 1W-W (Duncan, 2013) This popular mini bred from Gipsy Queen opens pale yellow and fades to white. Has been hard to find. \$6.00

Little Rusky 7Y-GYO (Watrous, 1989)(M-L) An American bred mini that blooms and multiples well. A good doer for the show bench. 1-2 florets per stem. \$2.50

Mary Plumstead 5Y-Y (Gray, 1954) (L) An older mini that is still show worthy with pale yellow coloring. 2-5 florets per stem. \$5.00

Snipe 6W-W (Wilson, 1948)(E-M) Amazing that a flower registered this long ago still wins regularly. An elegant and indispensable cyclamineus. \$3.00

Stocken 7Y-Y (1998) (L) Can be difficult to flower in this area, but well-formed and beautiful when it does. \$3.00

CLASSICS Daffodils (1940-1969) They may be vintage, but they can still bring ribbons home

Capisco 3W-GYR (Ballydorn, 1969) (E-M) A show-worthy classic.	
Kitty 6W-Y (Coleman, 1942) (E-M) Very pretty nodding cyclamineus flower.	\$5.00

Santa Claus 4W-W (Wilson, 1950) (very late) A classic as well as an intermediate for your very last show. \$10.00

Sugarbush 7W-YWW (Grey, 1954) (M) 1-2 florets per stem. This classic has an unusual color code. \$6.00

HISTORIC Daffodils (Pre-1940)

Butter and Eggs 4Y-Y (unknown, 1777) (Very Early) Named by the coloring in the flowers; a light
butter-yellow shading to orange at the center. Will form clumps if left undisturbed.\$4.00Cantatrice 1W-W (Wilson, 1936)(M) A favorite among those who love the oldies.\$6.00Croesus 2Y-YYO (John Charles Williams, 1912) (M) Named for King Croesus of Lydia was
renowned for his great wealth. He was said to have minted the first coins.\$6.00

Elegance 3Y-Y (Engleheart, 1908) Yellow perianth with a slightly deeper yellow corona. \$7.00

Stilton 9W-YYR (Champernowne, 1909) (M-L) Lovely older poet with a predominantly yellow cup. \$4.00
